net 64bit version doesn't work with the windows 7 64bit drivers that I have. Any suggestions would be greatly appreciated. A: After trying the other suggestions (and going back to a previous version of my drivers) I finally found a solution. It took a little bit of digging but I found the 64bit version of the .net 4.0 drivers on the hardware vendor's web site. They also have the 32bit version (though I assume they still sell them separately) that works with Windows 7 (and apparently 8 too). The following link will take you directly to the page that includes the drivers for my laptop (or at least it did when I last checked). In case this link changes in the future I've copied the following link for the specific drivers I needed. BOTH versions are for .net 4.0 drivers. You can download driver from the manufacturer's website for a number of models. For the wireless card, open Device Manager, choose View, then find the Wireless Network Adapter in the list. Click the "Update Driver" button on the bottom of the screen to find the 64-bit version. This also works for the .Net Framework 4.0 if you're looking for a driver to connect to a network. This really sucks. I was just in the market for a new camera and I was considering the Canon Powershot, but they just have a spotty track record of really really bad support for the newer models. Why does this not surprise me? PS: I'm not just bitter. I am really having trouble with the defective Lenses and my camera wont take a picture.
